

## MANDATORY PERSONAL EQUIPMENT LIST

### Scouts BSA:

Official BSA Field Uniform Shirt  
\*Official BSA Uniform Shorts  
BSA socks (several pairs)  
Official BSA Belt

### Venturers:

Official Venturing Uniform Shirt  
\*Official Venturing Uniform Shorts  
BSA socks (several pairs)  
Official BSA Belt

\* Participants may wear shorts similar in color to the official shorts with an inseam no shorter than 7 inches but not so long as to extend past the knee.

### Additional mandatory items:

Canteen or water bottle	Flashlight with extra batteries
Towels and washcloths	BSA Handbook
Personal first aid kit	Sleeping bag
Pens and pencils, a small pocket notebook	Watch or clock
Personal hygiene items: shampoo, deodorant, etc.	Compass
Backpack for overnight & daily travel around camp	Small pocketknife
Insect repellent	Sunscreen
Rain gear	Underwear
Hiking shoes, tennis shoes, or sneakers	Laundry bag for dirty clothes
Small tent <u>or</u> hammock with rainfly, straps, and stakes	BSA t-shirts

### Optional Personal Equipment

Camp chair for use at the campsite  
A light jacket  
Scouting books: Patrol Leaders Handbook  
Extra eyeglasses / Sunglasses  
Camera  
Pillow/pillowcase  
Pocket Money

### Cell phones:

Participants and staff may bring cell phones to NYLT but put them away during program activities/lessons. NYLT and the Tukabatchee Area Council are not responsible for lost cell phones.

### Items Not Allowed / Banned Items:

- \* Radios, cd players, computers, electronic games or toys, TVs
- \* Pornographic materials
- \* Ax, hatchet, sheath knives, or machetes.

### NOTE:

In addition to what to bring, we are accommodating the participants by allowing them to sleep in the adirondacks during the week. They will need a twin-size sheet for Sunday through Wednesday night, a pillow, and a blanket. Additionally, they can use their sleeping bag and bypass the sheet. A small tent or hammock is still required for Thursday evening. If using a hammock, a rain-fly is required.
